If addition, she was awarded the prestigious Sumners Foundation Scholarship. Lynn began her legal career practicing labor & employment law at Haynes and Boone and then as a trial attorney at Baker Botts for over five years.

Lynn's life was rich with experiences beyond her professional contributions. She found happiness in the everyday: cooking for those she loved, the peacefulness of the lake with her step-mother Jan, the crisp mountain air of Crested Butte, and the simplicity of curling up with a good book on the couch with her cats. But above all, her greatest joy came from watching her children, Rachel and Thomas, flourish in their artistic endeavors.
